#### Grants and Scholarships from Sandra Plummer

In addition to the **Elizabeth M. Eaton Trust Fund** grants reported last May, the Grants & Scholarships Committee awarded an additional \$1,926.70 to the Manatee River Garden Club for benches. The Harvest United Methodist Church returned their \$500.00 award for landscape beautification of community outreach facilities at the Bayshore Community Garden & Farm since the project was not going to be completed as projected.

The Grants & Scholarships Committee expects to have approximately \$10,000.00 from The Elizabeth M. Eaton Trust Fund to work with this year. These monies are to be used for community beautification projects in and around public areas in Manatee County, and funds are to be used solely for Section 501c3 purposes. Applications are available on our website.

The 2017-2018 recipients of our **MRGC Scholarship Awards** were Meagan Gigliotti and Meredith Platt. We wish them well in their studies and will stay in touch with them to see how they're doing. MRGC annually awards \$1,000.00 to several students who wish to pursue higher education goals in keeping with our mission, maintain a B average, and who are able to keep in touch with MRGC. Applications are available on our website.

Wekiva Youth Camp is a residential nature camp for 3<sup>rd</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade youngsters sponsored by the Florida Federation of Garden Clubs, Inc., and SEEK is FFGC's annual environmental conference for students entering grades 10 12. MRGC provides for two campers to attend Wekiva Youth Camp and one student to attend the SEEK conference. Registration for Wekiva begins January 1st and usually fills very quickly. SEEK registration also opens January 1st. If you know of any student who would benefit from either of these programs, please see any Grants & Scholarships Committee member.

15 years). It entails working with seniors attending adult day care at the Meals on Wheels Plus location at 10920 E. State Road 70 in Lakewood Ranch. It is held on the 4th Monday of each month of our season except December at 10:00am.

#### Hospitality Notes from Harriatt (Skeeter) Smith

Hello and welcome to another wonderful year of our Garden Club! I am Harriatt Smith (Skeeter), and I handle Hospitality for our club for this next season. I assign the dates for each of you to work one of the luncheons offered monthly. Please see the email you were sent on August 9<sup>th</sup> or go to our website under MEMBERS for your assigned month (click here). When you are assigned a month, you are asked to work for approximately 4 hours on the 3rd Wednesday of the month plus the day before for about 2 hours to set up.
